












ENTRY FEES

Entry fee of R1000 for SGDSAA affiliated anglers (R1200 for Non Affiliated SGDSAA anglers), to be paid prior to the competition commences, will include:-

- individual goodies bags with contents & shirts for all competitors
- additional "goodie box" for the skipper
- 1kg box of sponsored bait to be collected daily from The Tackle Box
- Sunday evening meal after registration & competition briefing
- Sponsored daily weigh in drinks & snacks
- Wednesday night social and evening meal
- Friday evening closing & Prize giving dinner
- Prizes

FISHING LICENCES, COF, SKIPPERS TICKETS & VHF LICENCES

- These are compulsory for ALL BOATS. Ensure you have certified copies of these on your boat in a waterproof container.
- The Secretary/Administrator of the Competition will be making up a file of these to have on hand and be able to present to DAFF, at any time. Please ensure a copy of these are sent through to Mandy Webster at admin@tscfishing.co.za or handed in at registration.
- Fishing Licenses The onus is on the Skipper and anglers to purchase these prior to the start of the competition. DAFF may be doing spot checks.

The payment for the above licenses are <u>not</u> part of the entrance fee.

MEDICAL ATTENDANCE AT INTERCLUB 2019

NSRI Station 20 Shelly Beach will be on standby for the duration of the competition to deal with emergencies.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

- Entry Fee for a fully paid up Southern Gauteng Member is R1000.00 per angler.
- Temporary membership for the 5 day duration of the competition will be R200,00.
 (Entry fee R1000,00 plus R200,00 temporary membership fee for all competitors who are not fully paid up SGDSAA affiliated club members whether senior, male, female or junior).
- Juniors must be under the age of <u>16 years</u> at the time of the competition.
- All Skippers to be SGDSAA club members as of the end of December 2018.
- Temporary Club membership will allow crew members to participate in the competition being fished 10-15 March 2019 and as such will be eligible to win prizes in the 2019 SGDSAA Interclub competition only.
- All boats must be in possession of a 2019 Seaworthy Disc.
- All Skippers must be in possession of a valid Skipper's Ticket.
- No non-anglers will be permitted on boats, other than the Hosting club may allow a non-angling sponsor, photographer or non-angling committee member to accompany a boat providing they do not attempt to catch fish.
- Any sponsor, who is a fully paid up member of a SGDSAA club, may duly enter into the 2019 SGDSAA Interclub and qualify for the points of any catches to count for any category or prizes.
- No harassing of Dolphins or other mammals as per Marine Bylaws.
- No Jigging will be allowed.
- No anchoring will be allowed.















FISHING AREA

- Skippers will be given a sea chart of the area at registration with weigh sheets
- The chart will be considered the boundaries.
- Northern Boundary Hibberdene
- Southern Boundary Port Edward

Skippers with Cat C Licence may only proceed 15 nm out to sea.

Skippers with Cat B Licence may only proceed 40 nm out to sea.

(Beach control to be informed at all times if Skippers go further than 15nm)

FISHING HOURS

- Launching from Shelly Beach Launch site from first light, (on Monday 11 March 2019 boat may only launch after the blessing of the fleet which will take place on the slipway at 05h00)
- Lines down will be after launching, there will be NO back line rule.
- There will be no lines up time during the duration of the competition however all skippers or crew members wanting to weigh fish or confirm a billfish, GT, Amberjack / Yellowtail or Kingfish release must be in the queue at weigh-in before the gallows close as stated in the programme with their catch.
- The Competition Committee may change fishing hours depending on launch & weather conditions.
- Under no circumstances will competition boats, whether they have caught fish during that day or not, be allowed to fish later than the competition hours as specified. All boats are to be beach or be at backline, waiting to beach no later than 16h00.
- Anglers arriving at the Gallows after cut off times (16h00 Monday to Thursday or 15h00 on Friday) will
 not receive a score for the day.
- No EXTRA TIME WILL BE ALLOWED.

RADIOS / RADIO PROCEDURE / CALL - UPS

- All boats are to ensure they have a working radio prior to launching each day. A radio test must be performed with Shelly Beach control tower prior to launching each day.
- Should a boat develop problems with the radio during a day's fishing, it is the skippers responsibility
 before launching the next day to satisfy Shelly Beach Control Tower that the boats radio has been
 repaired and is working properly prior to launching. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED –
 relaying call ups day after day is not acceptable
- All radio communications during the competition hours will take place on channel 12, call up will take place on channel 10. (to be confirmed at briefing)
- Call ups will be at 09h05 and 12h05
- All boats will be called up each day (Monday Friday) on channel 10 (to be confirmed at briefing)
- Your position and catch must be given
- Any billfish strikes or hook-ups must be reported immediately to Beach Control. Report your position, time and the angler's name to Beach Control.
- All Skippers will adhere to the Radio Procedure rules at all times.
- Skippers not adhering to correct radio procedure will be dealt with accordingly.
- Boats wanting to relay must relay all messages after the call up is complete!
- Please adhere to radio etiquette and be patient, your call will be attended to!
- CELL PHONE COMMUNICATION BETWEEN BOATS IS NOT ALLOWED.

Any boat not responding to call ups for the day will be disqualified by the Competition Committee

SAFETY / WEATHER COMMITTEE

The Safety/Weather committee appointed will be made up of the Deputy National Safety Officer, Anton Gets, the Tournament Director and one suitably qualified skipper from each club.

This is a *closed committee* and no bystanders or external influences will be allowed.















BEACH CONTROL

Beach Control will operate from first light until all boats have returned to the beach.

Beach Radio Control : Shelly Beach Control Tower

Beach Control : Marietjie Grater

Boat Pushers : BOAT PUSHERS WILL BE PROVIDED

Beach Control will liaise at all times with the Tournament Director and Competition Committee regarding decisions / incidents / problems etc.

LAUNCHING & LAUNCH SHEETS

- Launching and beaching daily will be permitted from Shelly Beach launch site only.
- Launch / weigh sheets will be issued to each skipper on Sunday 10 March 2019 at registration.
- All SKIPPERS must log/register their launch, pay launch fees (R57,00), and hand in their launch/weigh sheet **daily** at the Shelly Beach Tower. The skipper must complete the log book and have his valid documents available for inspection by Shelly Beach Control Tower daily.
- Please have the correct amount with you as the tower does not have change. Launch fees are <u>not</u> part of the entrance fee.
- Launching will take place at first light each day weather permitting.
- Tractors will be available to assist launching and retrieving of boats. Please make sure your name is with Marietjie Grater on the list after you have registered your launch in the tower.
- Launch sheets are to be filled in correctly and handed in to the Shelly Beach Tower each day prior to launching. If your launch sheet is not received, you will not receive a score for that day.
- Once the skipper has registered his launch in the log book, paid launch fees and handed in his weigh sheet, you will be required to perform a radio check after which you will be able to launch.
- Tractors will be available to push & retrieve boats. Please arrange payment with Mandy **prior** to the competition/at registration should you wish to make use of the tractor drivers.

Boats jumping the "LIST" will be penalised the next day and will be made to launch last.

BLOW OUTS

- The competition will run for the duration of the five days previously mentioned.
- Should the weather be inclement (bad) but fishable it will be each Skipper's decision whether he / she launches on that day.
- However, in the event of extreme weather conditions, the Safety/Weather committee reserves the right to cancel **or** postpone the competition, either prior to, or after the first boats have launched.
- Should launching be unfavourable at first light, a final decision as to whether to launch or not will be given by 10h00 the latest.
- Should the wind speed exceed 22 knots (Force 6), the Safety/Weather Committee will immediately call the competition off. (This is a SADSAA regulation).
- Should the competition be called off whilst boats are out at sea, <u>all boats</u> will return immediately to Shelly Beach Ski Boat Launch Site. Should a boat be fighting a fish, then that line must be cut immediately for the boat to return safely to base. This is a SADSAA Safety ruling.

NUMBER OF RODS

There are no restrictions on the number of fishing rods carried on the boat or used by any angler at any one time. It has therefore been decided that no cognisance shall be taken of the number of anglers on the boat when calculating the "Overall or Daily Boat Prizes".

















LINE CLASS

The competition has been structured for the following SADSAA approved line classes 10kg, 15kg and 37kg. *The IGFA rule relating to backing is in force*.

- The Skipper must nominate the line class being used by the boat for that day, prior to launching.
- Only one line class per boat per day is allowed for all anglers on the boat.
- Should any angler be found to utilize a heavier line than nominated, the boat on which he is fishing, the angler himself and all other anglers on that boat will be disqualified for that day and all days prior where the same line class was specified. The Tackle Master may test your line at any given time during the competition.
- The line tester will be available to all anglers, prior to the competition AT THE TIMES SPECIFIED if any angler wishes to have his line tested.
- The only instance where a line class greater than the nominated line class will be allowed on the boat, is when the line in question is to be utilised for the purpose of pulling a teaser.

FISHING TACKLE

- IGFA Rules will apply.
- Any form of teaser may be used provided it conforms to IGFA regulations.
- Fishing tackle may be checked daily on a random basis. (Please avail yourself of the facility to test your lines prior to fishing on Monday, as we are experiencing more and more problems with line breaking above its specified breaking point).
- The line tester will be available for competitors to test their lines at Shelly Beach SBC.

SAFETY

- Any boat that runs out of fuel will be disqualified for the day.
- All boats must have a valid 2019 Certificate of Fitness.
- All anglers will wear life jackets during launching and beaching.
- Please adhere to the boundaries on the sea chart provided.
- ALL BOATS MUST HAVE COPIES OF ALL DOCUMENTATION RELATING TO THEIR BOAT FOR POSSIBLE INSPECTIONS OUT AT SEA FROM SAMSA OFFICIALS....(RADIO, FISHING LICENCES, COF AND COC ETC......)
- The Deputy National Safety officer, any Safety Officer or any Samsa Safety Officer may do sot safety check of any boats safety equipment at any time, please ensure your equipment is all on board.
- Please ensure drogue anchors are correctly attached and easily accessible should the need arise.

WEIGH-IN

- The weigh-in shall be held at Shelly Beach SBC Gallows each day.
- All anglers wishing to weigh fish must be at the weigh in before the cut off times stated in the
 programme. Any angler arriving at the weigh in after the specified time 16h00 Day 1- 4 and 15h00
 Day 5 will not receive a score for that day. Please note that this rule will be strictly applied.
- The weigh in must be attended by the Skipper or his delegate and will be supervised by the Weigh Master and his assistants.
- The score sheets will be signed on a daily basis by the Skipper or his delegate and witnessed.
- All current records will be available at the weigh in each day.
- All Anglers weighing fish are asked to please wear Sponsors Shirts / Caps etc. when weighing fish.
- Any unwanted fish may be donated to Shelly Beach Ski-boat Club.

















POINTS SCORING

- The SADSAA points scoring system will be used.
- This system gives benefit to larger fish caught than the line strength used.
- Whatever the line strength used, a one to one fish (i.e. 10kg fish on 10kg line) gives a score of 32 points, which is then multiplied by the species factor applicable.

METHOD OF CALCULATION

The points for each individual fish will be calculated as follows: -

Score = $(Weight / Line Strength)^2 \times 32 \times Fish Factor$

- Fish weight divided by line strength in kilograms.
- The result squared and then multiplied by 32.
- This figure is then multiplied by the fish species factor applicable.

For example; A 30kg Yellowfin Tuna on 10kg line 30 divided by $10 = 3 \times 3 = 9 \times 32 \times 1 = 288$ points














SPECIAL BONUS POINTS (as per the multiplication factor)

• **Bonus points** will be awarded to a boat for the number of different species of fish/releases weighed each day.

Please note: These bonus points are awarded to the boat and not to the individual angler, irrespective of the number of anglers on the boat on the following basis. To qualify as a "species" the fish must weigh more than the minimum mass as per the rules. (Undersized fish do not qualify).

THE MULTIPLICATION FACTOR DOES NOT APPLY TO BILLFISH.

The Bonus points are added to the final total points for the boat per day provided the boat qualifies as per the table below:-

3 species caught Total Points multiplied by 2 (excluding billfish points)
4 species caught Total Points multiplied by 3 (excluding billfish points)

• **5** Bonus points will be awarded to a billfish caught on a circle hook, a clear photograph must be produced.

SPECIES LIMITATIONS

- Each boat may only weigh a maximum of 10 (ten) fish daily.
- Each boat may weigh a maximum of (15) FIFTEEN fish of any one species during the 5 day competition, irrespective of the weight of the fish, number of anglers on the boat, or the number of days fished.
- No sharks will count in the competition.
- Green job fish / Kakaap will COUNT AS A SPECIES.
- No Bottomfish will count or be brought to the scales.
- All GT Kingfish (Ignobilas) will count as (1) one species Catch, measure & release
- All other Kingfish spicies will be considered as (1) one species only Catch, measure & release
- All Marlin will be considered as (1) one species only Catch & release
- All Spearfish and sailfish will be considered as (1) one species only Catch & release
- All Tuna species will count on their own as an individual specie e.g. Yellowfin, Kawakawa, Skipjack, Bonito, Sarda Sarda etc will all count as a specie on their own.

All Billfish, GT, Amberjack & Kingfish will be released in this competition.

BILLFISH RELEASE

The committee has decided that for each species of released billfish; the points for this catch will be awarded AS per the list of weights specified for each line class.

No bonus points will be awarded for tagging a fish.

BILLFISH RELEASE PROCEDURE

ALL Billfish caught in this competition are to be released. Under no circumstances must a Billfish be brought to the beach after a days fishing.

Billfish must be brought alongside the boat and photographed, a photograph of the fish must be provided at the gallows before the cut of time for that day and must include:

- correct date and time of the catch.
- The fish being caught must be seen to be under control.
- In the event of a Sailfish or Spearfish this will be deemed as a crew member holding the bill and the Fish alongside the boat.
- If a large Marlin is caught holding onto the bill could be a safety issue and in this case "under control" will be considered if all the following criteria are met:
 - The leader the fish is caught on is in hand
 - The fish is directly alongside the boat swimming parallel to the boat on the surface















- The fish can be easily identified in the photograph
- The correct colour armband, (colour or shape requested by beach control)
- The released fish must be seen to swim away
- If the fish is not identifiable, then it will not count as a catch.
- The photo is to be in a digital format, which can be downloaded.

MULTIPLE HOOK UPS - THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

In the event of a double or a triple billfish release, the team are to liaise with Beach Control regarding colour coding of arm bands or symbols required in the photograph.

A WITNESS BOAT TO BE SUMMONED FOR A DOUBLE OR TRIPLE STRIKE

WITNESS BOATS.

- Only required for multiple hook-ups at which time the witness boat must positively identify both the fish and confirm the release of both the fish.
- The witness boat is there to confirm that multiple fish were caught and successfully released.
- Witness boat is to take photos <u>if</u> the boat catching the fish is unable to. The fish must be identifiable.
- If one fish is lost and only one Billfish is released, then it will revert back to the rule stating that a photo must be taken with the colour armband /symbol showing and the fish must be seen to be next to the boat, under control with leader in hand.
- The witness boat to radio the successful release AND RELEASE TIME to the Beach Control.

THERE ARE NO BONUS POINTS FOR WITNESS BOATS

RELEASING FISH OTHER THAN BILLFISH

Other than Billfish, Giant Travallys', Amberjacks / Yellowtail and all Kingfish must be released. However Amberjack and Yellowtail <u>in excess</u> of 15kg (as per the measure chart) may be brought to the scale however if the fish is less than 13,5kg (10% margin of error) when weighed THAT FISH will be disqualified from the days fishing

Species

 Giant Travally (Caranx ignobilis) will be considered a species on its own, all other Amberjack Species (Seriola Species) / Yellowtail will be considered as a single species. All other Kingfish will be considered as a single species

Stickers

- A sticker / measuring device will be issued on Sunday 10 March 2019 at registration to each skipper, for use to measure when releasing these fish.

Photographing the Fish

- The fish must be brought on board the boat, placed on the sticker, with the tail fork not protruding over the indicated tail side of the sticker.
- In the photographer the entire sticker and the entire fish must be visible.
- The sticker must be shown to be stretched to its full length without any folds or creases.
- The colour armband issued for the day must be visible in the photograph.
- A single photograph showing all the above, with the date and time of the catch must be provided.
- A photograph showing the release of the fish with date and time must also be provided.
- Only 15 fish per species (GT, Amberjack/Yellowtail and Kingfish) may be weighed for the week per boat.
 - All fish photographed are above the minimum size as indicated by the sticker
 - All fish caught on a single day vary by a least one colour band of the sticker in size.















RAIT

- There will be a 1kg box of bait sponsored to you daily, which can be collected at The Tackle Box
- Teams are to supply the balance of their own bait.
- No swopping of bait is allowing at sea.
- No live bait allowed on boats prior to launching.
- Breach of rules will result in disqualification.

BOAT FUEL/OIL

Teams to supply their own fuel and oil for the duration of the Competition.

TACKLE COMMITTEE CONTROL

- Each team may have their tackle checked daily by the Tackle Inspector.
- The tackle committee members may request line / leaders from anglers to be tested and may board your boat at any time to inspect your tackle box.
- The rod, reel and terminal tackle which caught any Billfish or fish which may count as the most meritorious fish for the day must be taken to the weigh in.

PROTESTS

Any protest made by any angler against the conduct or practices of another angler or boat must be made in writing and handed to the TOURNAMENT DIRECTOR within *30 minutes* of the end of the weigh in on the day of the incident in question. A protest must be accompanied by a protest fee of **R500,00 CASH** which is refundable should the protest be upheld. Protests must be handled through the club captains.

BREACH OF RULES OR MISCONDUCT

A Boat and its anglers may be disqualified for the day, if they are found to be in breach of the rules and/or procedures. Serious breaches of the rules or misconduct could result in the disqualification BY THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE.

Any incidents occurring which are not covered in these rules will be decided upon by the Tournament Director and the Competition Committee. The decisions made will be final and binding.

DAILY HAPPY HOUR

Sponsored Drinks and snacks will be provided daily at the Weigh In, please enjoy.

- NO JIGGING WILL BE ALLOWED.
- Spooning will be allowed provided the spoon is less than 150grams.















ROSEBOWL CALCULATION

All anglers present and registered on Sunday 10th March 2019 will officially compete in the Rosebowl scoring system, which is calculated as follows: -

- The sum of the club's total points scored based on the SADSAA scoring system
- plus bonus points received, as per the above,
- divided by the number of registered boats of that club as registered on Sunday 10th March 2019.

A minimum of 5 boats per club will be used for calculation purposes.

NB!

- If a boat is disqualified or does not launch or does not fish on any fishable day, it will still be included in the original number of registered boats competing.
- If a boat joins after day 1 of the competition, the boat will be added from day 1 of the competition.
- If a boat leaves the competition earlier than the last day of the competition the number of boats will remain the same
- A boat may be replaced with the same skipper and anglers, for mechanical failure.

No exceptions will be made to this rule, except under extreme circumstances as determined by the competition committee.
