Dear Mitchell,

Thank you very much for contacting Mr. Sipho Goge about what constitutes "specialised vertical jigging equipment" so that none of your fishing competition people break the rules of the competition authorisation. Mr. Goge contacted me and asked me to clarify the situation to you in writing so that you can show this document to anyone who has any concerns.

Vertical jigging is not legal in iSimangaliso as a result of an internal Park rule. Further to this, the possession of specialised jigging equipment is not legal. The definition of such equipment is not easy and thus we carried out special training for our staff at the main boat launch areas to explain the situation and show them such specialised equipment.

In short the "specialised equipment" is restricted to 'terminal tackle" mostly the jigs themselves. The presence of braid on fishing reels is not seen as illegal so long as it is not found along with jigs. As you mentioned the measure is to protect bottom fish and we would appreciate it if you did discourage your

people from dropshotting from boats as this does often catch these fish but dropshotting is legal so long as the shots are not very heavy and it is being used to circumvent the ban on jigging.

I hope this clarifies the situation to you and that you have a successful competition at Sodwana Bay.

Please let me know if you need any more information.

I am copying this to Mr. Goge so that he is also fully in the picture.








Learn to target and catch sailfish and billfish from experienced skippers and crew during Kenya's prime seasons.

#### **Captain Chaos**

Graham Morgan presented a special award at this year's Nomads prize giving. Here is the story...
