### 2023 Nomads Closed

• 3 -5 August 2023 - Shelly Beach.

This year the organising committee decided to try a different approach for the annual Nomads Closed - a short 3-day competition at Shelly Beach that has much to offer but has not hosted the Closed for over 20 years. The facilities and amenities available at Shelly Beach are logistically easier to manage compared to other venues. It was a young organising committee and this competition allowed them the opportunity to learn and understand the prerequisites for arranging competitions in the future - we wish them well in their first attempt.

The change in venue and a shortened competition only had five (5) boats enter which is a far cry from previous competitions. This is an item the organisers need to unpack going forward. Even with the reduced number of boats the Nomads *geez*, camaraderie and competitive spirit prevailed. When it came to fines, there were quite a few snitches amongst the crowd who provided the fines master with plenty of stories to be used. Based on the fines master's interpretation and severity of the

transgression, the guilty would receive their teaspoon of cinnamon and/or tequila shot. Over the few days there were some guilty parties who either didn't learn from their previous wrongdoings or they seemed to have developed a special likening for cinnamon!

Day1: After an early launch the boats went in different directions, each pursuing their own carefully crafted strategy which they hoped would give them an advantage over their competitors. Fishing was hard and the boats all came off the water early due to high winds. Only three (3) fish made it to the weigh-in - testament to the trying and difficult conditions. Aquaholic was the leading boat with a 6.8kg Kawa-Kawa caught by Elmar Basson.

Day2: With the competition still wide open and *WindGuru* predicting a great day, all teams headed to their secret spots. This was evident at the weigh-in with 15 fish being brought to the scales of which 12 were sorries due to minimum weight restrictions. The sorry competitors were disappointed but not the fines master who was grinning and smiling broadly. The day belonged to the new Hooker V skippered by Trevor Mosley. This was their second launch and Trevor weighed in with a nice yellowfin of 21.8kg and Mike Koch with a yellowfin of 24.6kg - both caught on 37kg line. With many of the other competitors losing fish to the taxman fishing 15kg line, it seems that 37kg was the wise choice.

Day3: The competition was still open and a good fish landed on lighter tackle whilst avoiding the sharks would surely win the competition. After a safe launch, each of the teams exercised their final day's strategy developed the previous evening (over many refreshments) to go and get the big one that would win them the competition. WindGuru predicted a fine days fishing. However, only seven (7) fish made it to the weigh-in with four (4) sorries - again the fines master was smiling! Trevor Mosely (Hooker V) produced a 22.2kg yellowfin, however, he was outdone by Adrian Feher (Aquaholic) who landed a 21.9kg yellowfin on 15kg line.


